HVCH converting to new employee email system

The HVCH email system is being converted tomorrow, May 31. The new email system is called Entrvst. Here are some Frequently Asked Questions about the conversion:

Q. Will I have a new email address?

A. No. Your email address will be the same after the conversion.

Q. Will my password be the same?

A. No. If you have not changed your email password, then it will be the same password with HV at the end of your password. If you do not know your password contact IT and they will give it to you over the phone.

Q. How do I access the new email system?

A. From Internet Explorer, go to http://webmail.hvch.org Please note that the current HVCH email shortcut on your desktop will not work until IT updates it with the new address.

Q. How will I learn how to use the Entvst email system?

A. Several ways. Once you have your password you can login and begin using the system, in addition, the online help in Entvrst is very user friendly and effective, also, IT will host tutorials in the computer lab staring on Friday, June 1st.

Q. Why are we migrating so fast to a new system?

A. IT has been evaluating the new system for the last 4-6 weeks but was just notified that the current system would be terminated June 1st, 2018 if significant capital was not invested to upgrade the old system. The new system will result in a \$5K savings.

O. What is Chat?

A. The new email system has Chat (instant messaging) functionality while logged into the webmail interface.

Q. Will I have access to my current emails after the conversion?

A. Yes and No. Yes, If you currently use Outlook to access email, then all email will be downloaded to your PC. Please note that after the conversion you will not be able to reply to those emails, but will be available for you to reference.

No, If you use the webmail client, then those emails will not be accessible after the conversion.

Q. Will the size of the mailbox be larger than the current system?

A. Yes. The Entrvst system mailbox size is 100x larger than the current system.

Q. Is there a new size limitation on attachments that are sent from Entryst?

A. No. The attachment limit is the same, which is 10MB.

Q. Will I still be able to set an out of office message in Entryst?

A. Yes, you set an out of message by going to Settings > Auto-responder.

Q. Does Entryst have a calendar function?

A. Yes. The busy search feature is located on the Scheduling tab of the calendar event. You will no longer need google calendar or companion link to sync calendars.

Q. How do I get email and my calendar to my phone?

A. IT will need to enable active-sync for your smartphone. Once this is completed you can access your current email and calendar from your phone.

Q. Will my contacts be migrated?

A. Contact IT and they will assist you with getting your contacts in the new system.

Q. If I created personal distribution lists, will they convert?

A. You will need to re-create the distribution list in Entvst. Contact IT if you need assistance.

Rehab Department benefits from Shriners donation

Equipment purchased through a grant from the Hocking Hills Shrine Club has been put to good use in the Hocking Valley Community Hospital Department of Rehabilitation.

Staff have been using the equipment for pediatric patients for the past several weeks. Equipment that was purchased with the \$13,260 donation includes:

- EasyStand StrapStand: Helps patients more easily stand during treatment without harm or injury to the therapist or patient.
- Hi Lo Tables: Tables have the ability to be lowered to a level of two feet and raised as high as four feet. The flexibility to adjust levels provides significantly easier access to patients of various sizes and physical limitations getting on and off the treatment

- table safely. It also allows the therapist to raise the patient to a height that is better for treatment necessary for the patient.
- lowa Oral Performance Instrument: The device is used to measure a patient's tongue strength, giving a base line measurement during initial evaluation, determining if decreased tongue strength is cause for the patient's difficulty swallowing and or speaking.

The Shriners have been in establishment since 1870, and are known for their support in caring for pediatric patients who have experienced orthopedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries and cleft lip and palate. HVCH thanks them for their continued support of the hospital.

June is Hernia Awareness Month

June 1-30 is hernia awareness month. Each year almost 750,000 Americans are treated for hernias, yet some experts believe hundreds of thousands suffer in silence because of fear of surgery.

What is a Hernia?

A hernia occurs when parts of an organ (usually the intestines) protrudes through a weak point or tear in the thin muscular wall that holds the abdominal organs in place. People at risk of developing a hernia are typically those performing chronic lifting or activities that require straining, which increases intra-abdominal pressure. However, the various types of hernias can occur in both males and females of any age.

Signs and Symptoms

Most people with hernias have a common set of signs and symptoms. A bulge is the most typical sign of a hernia. Hernias can cause discomfort or pain during your daily activities—especially when you exert yourself. They can also cause discomfort or pain during urination or bowel movements and a feeling of weakness or pressure in the groin area.

Patients should seek medical help if a hernia is suspected and should seek further evaluation by a medical professional—especially when pain or discomfort persists.
