Weekly Update

October is an exciting month for us in the radiology world. Not only do we celebrate breast cancer awareness, but we enjoy all the skeleton decorations brought out for Halloween; after all, we are bone photographers. While people typically associate x-rays with finding the broken bones, imaging can also help prevent fractures.

In August of this year, we partnered with Hologic, Inc. to upgrade our bone densitometry (DEXA scan) equipment which will provide our patients with the leading technology in screening for osteoporosis. A DEXA machine uses low level x-rays to measure the strength of a patient's bones. During this noninvasive, 15 minute test, measurements of the lower back and hip are taken and then interpreted by a Radiologist to determine if the patient has osteoporosis.

One benefit of this new scanner is the latest digital technology for better image quality leading to a more accurate diagnosis. The Hologic Horizon Ci also performs a Fracture Risk Assessment (FRAX). This diagnostic tool, developed by the World Health Organization, examines clinical factors and bone mineral density providing a 10-year fracture probability for patients due to osteoporosis.

So, what exactly is osteoporosis? The definition is "porous bone" and it occurs when the body loses too much bony matter causing weakness of the actual structure. Ninety percent of our bone mass is acquired between birth and age 20 reaching a peak between the ages of

25-30. Over the next ten years, our bodies begin to lose this bone mass, and weakening of the structures is typically seen in patients over the age of 60.

Millions of patients are affected by osteoporosis and statistics show it has a significant impact on a patient's quality of life as well as increased healthcare costs. The National Osteoporosis Foundation (NOF) estimates that over 800,000 visits to the emergency room, three million fractures, and up to \$25.3 billion per year are due to this disease process. While osteoporosis is primarily detected in the aging population, it is serious for anyone who has multiple risk factors. Over 50% of patients go undiagnosed. Therefore, the NOF recommends an initial DEXA scan if you:

- are a woman 65 or older or a man who is 70 or older
- break a bone after the age of 50
- are a woman of menopausal age or a man aged 50-69 with risk factors

Risk factors include a family history of osteoporosis or osteopenia, a poor diet, smoking or an inactive lifestyle. Your doctor may recommend a bone density exam if you have certain diseases and/or prolonged use of specific medications.

In addition to screening and proper treatment, patients can prevent fractures and maintain bone density by:

- participating in regular weight-bearing and muscle strengthening exercises
- maintaining a healthy diet
- not smoking or drinking excessively
- eliminating and avoiding fall risks in your environment
- having subsequent screenings every 1-2 years

Our staff strives to demonstrate exceptional care to the people in our community through compassionate treatment and technological advancements. This new DEXA scanner is just one way we continue to provide the best care possible to our patients.
