

According to a national survey released by the American Academy of Ophthalmology, nearly two out of three American adults report having eye or vision problems. A significant percentage of them, however, fail to seek medical attention in the form of regular, sight-saving eye exams. In observance of Healthy Aging Month in September, Hocking Valley Community Hospital joins the American Academy of Ophthalmology in emphasizing the importance of having regular eye exams to maintain healthy eyes and vision.

Some of the more common agerelated eye diseases include agerelated macular degeneration, cataract, diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma. Early detection and treatment of these conditions can help to save sight before vision loss occurs. Ophthalmologists – the physicians that specialize in medical and surgical eye care – recommend a dilated comprehensive eye exam as the best way to prevent these conditions from becoming debilitating.

Findings showed that 64 percent of adults had at least one or more of the following issues with their eyes or vision:

- difficulty seeing at night;
- blurry vision;
- reading up close;
- flashes of light;
- red, watery eyes; and,
- double vision.

Despite experiencing some level of impairment, only 13 percent admitted they had been seen by an ophthalmologist.

A healthy adult get a baseline eye exam at age 40, even if they have no history of eye problems or eye disease. Those who have chronic conditions, such as diabetes or high blood pressure, may require more frequent exams.

SPOTLIGHT ON: Rehabilitation

HVCH Rehabilitation Department has 36 employees consisting of Physical Therapists, Physical Therapy Assistants, Occupational Therapists, Certified Occupational Therapy Assistants, Speech Therapists and clerical staff.

The Outpatient Clinic has:

- 1,200 Physical Therapy visits per month
- 200 Occupational Therapy visits per month
- 120 Speech Therapy visits per month Inpatient Therapy services provide:
- 300 Physical Therapy Treatments per month
- 150 Occupational Therapy treatments per month
- 15 Speech Therapy treatments per month

The Rehabilitation Department also provides Occupational Therapy services to the students of the Logan-Hocking School District. They are in seven school buildings each day and provide services to approximately 260 students.

Physical Therapy Services include: Orthopedics, Neurological, Pediatric, Vestibular, Wheelchair evaluations, SI adjustments, and Inpatient services

Occupational Therapy Services include: Orthopedics, Carpal Tunnel, Adaptive Equipment, Neurological, Pediatrics, OT services in the schools and for Inpatients

Speech Therapy Services include: Pediatrics, Adult, Barium Swallowing Evaluations, and Inpatients services
