

Human Kidneys and Bladder



It's National Bladder Health Month!

Did you know the bladder is a hollow, balloon shaped organ, and is mostly made of muscle?

On average, the bladder holds about two cups of urine (about 16 ounces).

When the bladder is empty it looks like a deflated balloon. The shape of a bladder changes when it fills up.

Urine is produced in the kidneys. It flows through tubes called ureters into the bladder.

It's normal to go to the bathroom 4 to 8 times a day and no more than twice a night.

Women have shorter urethras than

men and are more likely to get a bladder infection as bacteria from outside the body can get into the urinary system easier.

The bladder muscle helps you urinate by squeezing to force out urine.

Keeping Your Bladder Healthy

- Drink plenty of water. Strive to drink 6 to 8 cups of water each day.
- Cut down on the amount of caffeine and alcohol you drink these may upset your bladder. Limit your intake of coffee, tea or cola as these can heighten bladder activity and lead to leakage.
- Women should sit to go to the

Some days we're just where we're supposed to be. The initial plan for decorating was a few weeks out. I'm so glad I didn't wait. We need to realize it's a true gift we are given with these happenings, giving us an unexpected way to bless others. Did it take time away from my already full day? Sure it did. toilet – they should not hover over the toilet seat.

- Take your time when on the toilet so that your bladder can empty - if you rush, and do not empty your bladder fully, over time, you could get a bladder infection.
- Stay away from foods that bother the bladder. Some foods can worsen incontinence. Skip foods like chocolate (also a source of caffeine), as well as spicy or acidic foods like tomatoes and citrus fruits.
- Keep your pelvic floor muscles strong with pelvic floor muscle training.
- Stop smoking. It is of great value to stop smoking for your bladder health - using tobacco is a major cause of bladder cancer.

Some people suffer from overactive bladder or incontinence. Overactive bladder affects more than 33 million US adults. The severity of urinary incontinence ranges from the occasional leaking of urine when you cough or sneeze to having an urge or that "gotta go" feeling that's so sudden and strong, you may not make it to the bathroom in time. Included in this exciting event, is the "paw-paw" tree competition/Chinese auction and we are asking you to consider participating. Proceeds go to the Hocking County Humane Society.

HOW IT WORKS:













- You and/or your organization registers by Nov. 30 to donate an artificial tree between 2-3 ft in height (table top.) There is no cost to enter. Decorations should be 100% animal themed and can be homemade or purchased. Consider trees decorated in stuffed animal toys, TV animal character themes, usable items such as lead ropes, collars, pet clothes, pet treats, or animal toys. Animal themed ornaments/lights, etc. The options are endless—check out Pinterest!
- Trees are to be delivered to HVCH between 10 am and noon on Monday, Dec. 2. at the CIC building next to the hospital. Enter through the side door and go to the first office on the right.
- Trees will be on display from 4:00 pm to 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 3, and auctioned off through Chinese auction at 7:00 p.m. Winner need not be present to win.
- All tree lights should be battery operated only. Electricity not provided.
- Guests will have the opportunity to judge 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places during the event.
- Auction winners may pick up their trees that evening or any day between Dec. 4-6th. Trees not picked up by this date will be donated to the Hocking County Humane Society. Winners are also encouraged to consider donating their winning tree to the local humane society to help with their needs during the winter months.
